Title: Global & Regional Inter-Professional

Education Plus Program (GRIP)

The GRIP program fosters inter-professional collaboration, cultural exchange, and academic enrichment through immersive experiences at Chiba University in Japan.

Objectives

- Foster greater cultural awareness and appreciation by immersing students in different cultural environments, promoting global citizenship and cross-cultural communication skills.
- Enhance educational experiences by providing access to diverse academic resources, teaching methods, and curricular offerings.
- Improve language skills through immersion in a foreign language environment, facilitating fluency and practical usage.
- Encourage personal development by challenging students to adapt to new surroundings, navigate unfamiliar situations, and develop self-reliance and resilience.
- Build international networks by connecting students with peers, educators, and professionals.

Policy

- Define clear eligibility criteria for participation, including academic performance, language proficiency, and personal attributes such as adaptability and cultural openness.
- Establish a transparent application process that includes submission of relevant documents, interviews, and selection based on merit and motivation.
- Provide information on available scholarships, grants, and financial aid
- Implement measures to ensure the safety and well-being of students abroad,



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- Develop and maintain partnerships with reputable institutions abroad to facilitate exchange opportunities and ensure academic quality and support.
- Provide training for students on cultural sensitivity and adaptation

Execution:

The execution of the GRIP program involves meticulous planning and coordination. The program is promoted through informational sessions and online platforms to attract students and faculty. A rigorous selection process ensures participants meet eligibility criteria and have the potential to benefit from the exchange. Comprehensive pre-departure orientations cover cultural adaptation, academic expectations, and safety. Continuous support is provided through regular check-ins, counseling services, and peer networks during the exchange period. Collaboration with Chiba University ensures participants have access to necessary resources, including housing and academic advising.

Learning outcome:

Participants demonstrate increased engagement and interest in their studies and professional activities. They show enhanced critical thinking and collaborative skills by working on interdisciplinary projects. Cultural competence is gained, with participants developing a deep respect for Japanese culture and an ability to work in multicultural environments. They also acquire a broader worldview and a greater understanding of global issues, fostering informed and responsible global citizenship.



9:00

Morning briefing was taken by Dr. Nakajima at the Chiba University about Sanya Area and Sanyukai.

It is a Nonprofit Organisation established to provide support to the homeless community in the Sanya area.

Sanya area has a history of having lodgings for travelers since the Edo period. After World War II there were several displaced refugees and camps were set for their relief. These camps evolved into "Blue Tents" which are now shelters for the homeless people along the river.

10:00-01:00 Commute to location Lunch

1:00

Lecture on the history of Sanya area and Sanyukai was taken by the vice president of the NPO. We were told about the condition during the Edo period and after the World War II. The users of Sanyukai receive facilities like:

- Medical support
- Nursing support
- Community
- Soup Runs
- Personal counselling, etc.

The users of Sanyukai often don't have permanent addresses because of which they are unable avail government service like Government subsidies. However, these people can live in cheap lodgings called "Douya". This gives them an address and allows them to apply for government services.

The other faction, who live in Blue Tents do no have any address, and hence, no government support. So, Sanyukai helps these people by providing medical and social support.

Most of these people are elderly men, and do not have families. Sanyukai has built a "Grave for Our Friends" which is a common grave for all the friends at the Sanyukai; a place of remembrance for those who have passed away.

Sanyukai provides meal drives like Outreach program and Soup Run, where they go to the riverside area and provide soup and onigiri (rice balls) to the homeless.

3:00

We saw the building and place of operation of Sanyukai. They also have a nursing clinic right in the same building. One nurse is present at the clinic at all times, and various doctors do weelky visits to the clinic and provide care to the people for free.

4:00

Debriefing was done at the Sanyukai facility. We all shared our views and learning's with each other, and ended the day there.

We were not allowed to take many picture inside since it was a private facility and the people would not be comfortable. We are sharing the pictures that are available.

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DAY 05

Date: March 05, 2024

9:00

Briefing was done about both the centres that were scheduled for the day- Jouhoku Centre, and Cosmos.

Jouhoku is a government funded welfare center for day-workers. They provide jobs to people on a day-to-day basis, and the users are able to benefit from some other resources of the facility such as health check ups, recreation etc.

Cosmos is nursing center which provides home visits, assisted living and daycare for the elderly.

11:00-12:00

First we visited the Labour Welfare Centre.

We were able to see the place where the users of Jouhoku come to apply for jobs. This was also the same place where we got to see some Cosmos nurses who had come for a visit for the health checkup of the workers. The centre also had a Tuberculosis Centre where they screen for and treat people who might have Tuberculosis. The clinic was in the basement so as to keep any infectious patients isolated if required. There are also counseling services for the workers to cope with job loss or other matters.

1:00-3:00 Cosmos Visit.

Cosmos Nursing Centre was especially informative. They provide services like:

- Day care
- Home visits
- Assisted living Ohana

We met the people at the daycare and were able to participate with them in an activity of karaoke.

Unfortunately it was not allowed to take pictures with them for their privacy.

Then we headed to Ohana which is their assisted living home. It has a capacity of 21 people. The users are given 24 hour nursing care by two live-in nurses. They prepare meals, provide hygiene, medical and nursing care.

3:00-4:00

Lastly we saw a Hospice Care Centre.

We saw a prayer room where they housed the portraits of those people who had passed away. They room was very inclusive, respectful of various religions.

Debriefing was done at the Cosmos center.

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DAY 06 Date: March 06, 2024

Briefing:

Today the briefing was taken near the site.

Sanyukai conducts weekly outreach sessions to provide food and clothing donated by the volunteers to the homeless people along the Sumeda river. We were accompanied by 5 volunteers today.

Outreach:

The outreach was conducted along the Sumeda River. Many homeless people living along the river reside in "blue tents". We assisted in distributing food packages prepared by the volunteers along with some fruit and clothes to the homeless.

Due to the cold, we were told, not many people stayed along the river. This affected the number of people we were able to serve today.

However the goal of the outreach was to provide food to those who need it and communicate with them. Both of which were attained.

It was a very fulfilling experience, and we were able to see the actual living conditions of the homeless people in Japan.



DAY 07 Date: March 07, 2024

Briefing done on site in Santa area.

Sanyukai hosts a weekly free clinic for homelessness people, and others in need. Different specialty doctors visit every week, along with two volunteer nurses. This week a psychiatrist and an acupuncturist were working at the clinic. All the workers volunteer for free to provide not only physical but also mental and emotional treatment to people. Sanyukai's clinic can prescribe medications and is one of the few free clinics certified by the Health Department.

10:00

The free clinic runs from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm. They attend to all those who come to the clinic irrespective of gender, background etc.

The doctor of psychiatry worked as a general practitioner, assisted by two nurses.

They not only checked the patients' vital parameters and physical ailments, but the doctor was such a friendly person that people were glad to just come to the clinic to talk to someone. The doctor also brought some food that was given out to each patient, and the clinic offers tea to all those who come.

We were able to assist the nurses in some basic procedures. A student participated in physical examination and, I (ayesha) was able to assist in checking blood sugar level of a patient. The clinic runs for as long as the patients are there and there is no pressure or hurry to finish with the patients. The doctor and nurses talk to the patient as much as they need and assist them as required. If they are unable to provide help at the clinic they direct the patients to hospitals where they can get help.

Debriefing was done at the clinic, along with the doctors and the nurses present there.
